In Noontara, girls are typically married off at the tender ages of 12 to 14, while boys are thrust into the world of earning money from their early years. It's a place where opportunities for education are rare, with no public or private school within a 3 km radius, leading the current generation to remain out of school.



Our khojis, with their unwavering dedication, have taken on a multi-faceted role at Anatmool. In addition to engaging with the children in the classroom, they have embarked on a mission to teach the kids how to swim. In a village surrounded by water bodies, this skill is not only empowering but also life-saving. But that's not all. The khojis have also introduced special skating classes, providing the children with an opportunity to explore a world of excitement and physical activity. These sessions serve as a testament to the khojis' commitment to holistic development and expanding horizons.
